Highlights for FY23

Northwest Iowa Regional STEM Advisory Board of the Iowa Governor's STEM Advisory Council awarded two STEM Scale-Up Program grants to the library. Library staff have been using this STEM equipment during youth programs. Lisa Vander Sluis and Shelby Holbrook also created STEM PACKS which can be checked out for families to use Bee-Bots, Cubetto, and Snap Circuits at home.

The first Plymouth County Library Trustee Event was held in May. Trustees from Cherokee & Sioux County also attended the session which featured Bonnie Mckewon from the State Library present, "The art of the board meeting."

The State Library of Iowa awarded the Le Mars Public Library a Space Utilization Grant on July 1. As result of this grant the library hired FEH Design to conduct a space needs assessment for the library. The final assessment recommends a library building of 20,000-25,042 (gross square feet). Currently the library is 7,839 square feet. The Library Board and staff are looking forward to the release of the Le Mars Community Development Plan to determine the next steps in providing a library space that will meet the needs of our growing community
